products and environmental testing. He is also President of Destin Properties Corp., a land development properties entity with locations in Louisiana and Florida.

After 40 years, Hebert returned to college and completed a Bachelor's degree from the University of Louisiana at Lafayette in December 2012 and is already working on a Master's degree.

Parliamentarian Martin was appointed to the Board in 2011. Woodley to Begin Statewide Tour of Campuses

New University of Louisiana System President Sandra Woodley announced next week she will begin a statewide tour of the UL System's nine universities.



Starting with McNeese State University in Lake Charles on Jan. 18 and ending with Nicholls State University in Thibodaux on Feb. 20, Woodley plans to meet with each university's administrative team, faculty, staff, students, and community leaders.

"The goal for me is listening and working my way up the learning curve. I know there are a lot of strengths in our system, and I am particularly excited about going to our institutions and gathering as much information as possible that will guide my work," said Woodley.
